

## CBRC 2010 Rules and point divisions

Must be a CBRC member in good standing for any points to begin accumulating

Point system will be 5 points for 1<sup>ST</sup> place, 4 points for 2<sup>nd</sup> place, 3 points for 3<sup>rd</sup> place, 2 points for 4<sup>TH</sup> place, and 1 point for 5<sup>th</sup> place. (PER MARCH 2010 CBRC MEETING)

Age groups for youth will be based on age as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of subject calendar year.

For judged events, a long or short sleeved, collared shirt is required. Western classes also require a western hat or helmet.

Riders 17 and under have the option of showing in a higher age division. Once that rider moves up an age division, they must remain there for the remainder of the season.

Entries close three classes prior to event.

Should death or injury occur to a horse during the season, the rider may make a request to the Board of Directors to grant a replacement animal. In the case of injury, it must be documented by a licensed veterinarian. The majority of the Board is required for the exception to be granted. This may be done only once during the show season. The replacement animal must be used for the remainder of the season.

Any exhibitor displaying conduct unbecoming a member including, but not limited to, cursing, fighting, or inhumane treatment of an animal will be excused immediately from the show grounds by any member of the Board of Directors and all points accumulated during that show will be forfeited.

For individual classes a year end high points trophies or donated item will given out in all classes with the exception of " Fun Events", as noted on the show sheet. Points will be accumulated by horse and rider for that class for the entire season for end of year high points in that particular class. Example: Adult Trail Class – if a rider shows horse A at one show and horse B at the next show the points will not add up together at year's end. Rider's points on horse A will be tallied separately from riders points on horse B, as if they were separate exhibitors.

Fun classes will not receive high points or awards.

There will be **11** belt buckles given as overall awards. The divisions are listed below, as well as the classes in which a rider can earn points toward that particular award. Horse and rider must be the same combination for points to accumulate within a class. However, a rider may use different horse in each class within the overall divisions. Year end points from each class will be tallied together, under the rider's name, in the overall division, to attain the award. Example, for the Open Racking the rider's points on "Horse A" from Country Pleasure will be tallied with his points from "Horse B" in Style Racking. At year's end the RIDERS points form horse A and B will be combined for the chance at the overall Open Racking Award.
